Prangley was robbed of his glorious ten for in on innings, an accomplishment only ever completed once in Warrandyte history with Jack Wright and Matt Steed each grabbing a wicket each to have Lilydale all out for 94. The Fours batsmen came out pumped up after Prangers inspirational bowling, with old warhorse Greg Creber grabbing the limelight again with an unbeaten knock of 102, helped by fours debutant Daniel Large (53\*) and Brendan Zach (30). ## THE WCC ON FIRE!! (THE GOOD SORT)

The Seconds entered their first two dayer of the year, and selected to bat first after Cam Days third Toss win of the year with rumor he has been practicing a lot in the off season / personal time. After losing two early wickets Mark Centofanti put on a man of the match performance to drag Warrandyte back into contention with a well put together 63 off 43 overs, supported sporadically by Wellesley (43). Just when it looked like Warrandyte would hit Norwood out of the Match, they lost Day, Landers and Beardall after they had established themselves well, and limped to the line with the help of Dan Barry and Alex McIntosh truly proving to every one Macca's batting capability and maturity, and the fact that Barry can never seem to get a run yet batting with a maturity beyond his years. Warrandyte had 249 to defend and defend they did, after Norwood made a strong start, they were shut down by Barry and Beardall spin after a strong opening attack from spearhead Tyson Walshe and the ever reliable Steve Warr. With Barry and Beardall choking the batsmen of runs, wickets started to fall at a consistent rate, with Norwood limping into tea. What must be noted is the surprise choice of Wellesley into the attack for 4 overs before tea by captain Day, which was further supported when Dan was smacked over midwicket by a thirteen year old kid. The Firsts were coming off an outstanding run chance the week before and a confident squad headed to Lilydale and this was shown early with Gerald Walshe (3/22), Campbell Holland (3/24) and Clint Thomas (2/30) demolishing Lilydale for 116. The boys had 20 odd overs to bat out they day and they looked strong early with opener Ben Taylor channeling Matty Hayden to score a solid 22, supported by Adam White, coming off his century stand, with 38. Unfortunately, no one else offered much resistance and Warrandyte crumbled to be 7/92 over night with Lee Evans and Matt Sazenis looking to come back the next week and get the boys over the line. Sazenis was able to get Warrandyte over the line, with the help of Gerald Walshe's hamstring and Chapman's diving ability and were an important lead that Warrandyte was able to send Lilydale back into bat to see how they day would unfold. Warrandyte again got the ten wickets needed with Matt Sazenis providing a man of the match performance to pick up 6/37 supported by Evans and Holland, both picking up two wickets. With Warrandyte needing 115 off the final 11 overs Lilydale surely thought that was the game over, but in a fantastic display of cricket Warrandyte fell agonizingly short of a shock outright defeat, with Holland starring with the bat, making a quick fire 48.
