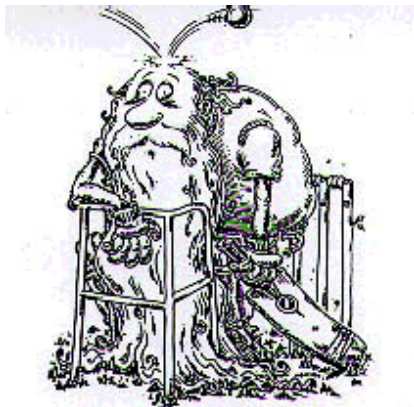

Installing a Husband

Dear Tech Support,

Last year I upgraded from [Boyfriend 5.0](#) to [Husband 1.0](#) and noticed a distinct slow down in overall system performance, particularly in the flower and jewellery applications, which operated flawlessly under [Boyfriend 5.0](#).

In addition, [Husband 1.0](#) uninstalled many other valuable programs, such as [Romance 9.5](#) and [Personal Attention 6.5](#), and then installed undesirable programs such as [NBL 5.0](#), [AFL 3.0](#) and [Golf Clubs 4.1](#). [Conversation 8.0](#) no longer runs, and [Housecleaning 2.6](#) simply crashes the system.

Please note that I have tried running [Nagging 5.3](#) to fix these problems, but to no avail. What can I do?

First, keep in mind, [Boyfriend 5.0](#) is an Entertainment Package, while [Husband 1.0](#) is an operating system.

Please enter command: [ithoughtyoulovedme.html](#) and try to download [Tears 6.2](#) and do not forget to install the [Guilt 3.0](#) update.

If that application works as designed, [Husband1.0](#) should then automatically run the applications [Jewelry 2.0](#) and [Flowers 3.5](#).

However, remember, overuse of the above application can cause [Husband 1.0](#) to default to [Grumpy Silence 2.5](#), [Happy Hour 7.0](#) or [Beer 6.1](#).

Please note that [Beer 6.1](#) is a very bad program that will download the [Farting and Snoring Loudly Beta](#).

Whatever you do, [DO NOT](#) under any circumstances instal [Mother-In-Law 1.0](#) (it runs a virus in the background that will eventually seize control of all your system resources.)

In addition, please do not attempt to reinstall the [Boyfriend 5.0](#) program. These are unsupported applications and will crash [Husband 1.0](#).
