It will be a feast of cricket and there will be plenty of other action to appeal to the entire family.

Among the attractions will be:

- A 10-kilometre fun-run. Entry forms will be distributed soon for this event, which will provide ideal training for the Big M Marathon.

- A bike-riding competition for under-14s. First prize is a new bicycle.

- Games for the children, with prizes.

- Past-players' reunion. All former players are urged to be there to join in the fun and renew old acquaintances.

Barbecues and refreshments will be readily available at the ground.

Two books — The History of Warrandyte and a recipe book — produced specially for the club's anniversary year, will be on sale. They are fine collector's pieces.

DEVASTATING DYTES IN RUN RIOT

Warrandyte raced into the A-grade finals of the Ringwood district cricket competition with a huge win over Glen Park.

The Dytes went on a run rampage to score 8/526.

Officials believe it is the highest score in the 125-year history of the club.

The run orgy was led by Bruce Kline, who retired after a dashing 101.

Geoff Taylor compounded Glen Park's misery with an unbeaten 91, Fred Jungwirth hit up 85 and Steve Pascoe 77.

Led by leg-spinner Bob McDonald, Warrandyte had bundled Glen Park out for 112. McDonald finished with 5/32.

The win sent the Dytes into the finals full of confidence.

They qualified on top of the ladder and are logical favourites for the pennant.

Warrandyte also have excellent prospects of premierships in other grades.

The depth of talent in the club right down to the Under-12s is demonstrated by the fact that seven of the 10 teams are in the finals.

Only the women's team, the I-Grade and the Under-16s missed out.

The anniversary gala day at the recreation reserve last month was a big success socially, but fell short of the fund-raising target.

Warrandyte were narrowly beaten by Melbourne Cricket Club in the limited-over game.

Batting first, Melbourne made 8/202 and dismissed Warrandyte for 185 after the locals had made a fine start.

Pascoe top-scored for the Dytes with 46. Mark Davis contributed 33 and Richard Bowen and John McCartin 27 apiece.

McDonald was the most successful bowler, taking 4/52.
