BLOODS' FLYING START!

Big win sets ball rolling

Warrandyte have started the 1979 football season in spectacular fashion.

The Bloods — with many new players in the team — thrashed highly-rated Coldstream by almost eight goals, 18.7 to 9.15, in the opening match.

Coldstream have been runners-up for the past two seasons and had beaten Lilydale, who are in a higher division, in their last practice match.

Warrandyte turned in a real team effort.

They outclassed Coldstream in all departments in the first half to lead 11.4 to 1.9 at the interval.

Warwick Blair was in superb touch whether ruck-roving or on the wing and captain-coach Colin Bawden was an inspiration as he rucked virtually unchanged.

The Bloods relaxed a little in the third quarter and Coldstream outscored them for the term.

But Bawden stirred them up in his three-quarter-time pep-talk and they kicked right on.

Warrandyte had many good players apart from Blair (best afield) and Bawden.

Bob Hayward, playing at full-back for the first time, shut his opponent right out of the game.

Rover "Tich" McCartin was in everything and newcomers Lou Amos and Richard Kingwell showed enormous potential.

"It was a great performance by the entire team," said club president Laurie Sloan.

"We need another big ruckman to help Bawden with the heavy work, but it is certainly a most encouraging start to the season."

The seconds made it a great Warrandyte double by beating Coldstream by 20 points.

Taylor made 129 and McCutchan an unbeaten 20 in Warrandyte's total of 269.
