

# Dytes' day of glory

### Warrandyte Cricket Club have done the impossible!

In just two seasons they have come from "nowhere" to be Ringwood District Cricket Association champions.

The Dytes took off the Chandler Shield in a hairraising grand final against South Wantirna at East Ringwood.

In a day of high drama: • The seniors scraped home in near-darkness after a second-innings batting collapse almost reversed what should have been a comfortable first-innings win.

• The under-14 (1) side lost their grand final against South Wantirna by just six runs.

• The under-14 (4) team beat Norwood by five runs. The seniors survived a

game which did nothing for those with suspect hearts.

Sent in to bat, they recovered from 9/135 to make 190. The heroes were John McCartin who made an unconquered 44, and Stan Davis, who just stayed there.

Davis grabbed the limelight again with 5/33 as South Wantirna collapsed from 0/30 to be all out for

Nobody could have predicted what was to follow.

Warrandyte fell apart in their second innings and were dismissed for 96. Only Richard Bowen, who made 27, offered real resistance.

It left South Wantirna 24 overs in which to make 159. They finished at 8/131 in one of the most exciting grand finals in the history of the Chandler Shield competition.
